8 Purpose and Activity

Project Title: Women's Resilience Against Gender Disinformation

Purpose:

Deeply rooted gender norms, patriarchal systems and structural inequalities between women and men continue to impact women's role in Georgian society. Perceptions of women in public life and women taking leadership positions remain highly inequitable and women disproportionately suffer from the burden of domestic work and unpaid care1. Various forms of gender-based violence against women also continue to be normalised2. In addition to this long list of challenges facing women in Georgia, feminist groups, women's rights organisations (WROs) and women in public life (WIPL) have recently been facing particular risks from the rise of neo-nationalist sentiments and groups in Georgia, who link feminism, equality and inclusion to being anti-family and opposing national interests and traditions. The backlashes against the advancement of women's rights as well as assaults on civil society as a whole is but one element of the changing political landscape in Georgia (driven by the geopolitical context in the region)3 and is gaining traction with conservative politicians and their supporters, posing an urgent threat to the status of CSOs, including women's organisations.

At the same time, GID (gender and identity-based disinformation) on social media have also been growing, targeting individual women's rights defenders and undermining public support for gender equality and non-discrimination. These narratives question the efforts and loyalty of WROs and associate them with values that are supposedly incompatible with Georgian identity. WIPL are increasingly targeted during election periods (Georgia will have parliamentary elections in 2024), which are characterised with intense image-based abuse, disinformation, defamation and hate speech. Sapari has often witnessed disinformation campaigns not only against its own Director which have featured in many reports on gender disinformation in Georgia4, but also against partner organisations and women activists in Kakheti, Samtskhe-Javakheti, Racha or Kvemo Kartli, where gender disinformation campaigns are more localised, contextualised and often non-technological (occurring through face-to-face conversation and word of mouth), thus often falling off the radar of monitoring and response interventions. Gender disinformation can have profound and detrimental effects on women in public and political life and even more so in case of women working in small localities with strong community ties and tight networks. It can compel them to withdraw from public life in order to shield themselves and their families from the emotional, physical, social, and economic risks associated with it, cause them to reduce their civic involvement and engage in self-censorship. This, in turn, can have adverse repercussions on Georgia's institutions, communities, and democracy in general.

Project Objectives:

Understanding the threats posed by the gender and identity-based disinformation quickly spreading and growing in Georgia, Sapari sees the need to build preparedness and resilience of women's rights organisations, particularly those outside the capital city, against GID through knowledge building and experience-sharing, and forging supportive networks and environments for women activists from various regions of Georgia to assist one another and mobilise knowledge and resources to collectively combat GID.

The Overall Objective of the project is to counter gender disinformation and misinformation in Georgia, in order to protect and promote the rights of women and girls. By empowering women's rights defenders and activists in identifying and challenging gender disinformation and enhancing resilience of women's rights organisations and service providers against GID, the project will contribute to building a more just, equitable and safe environment for women and girls in Georgia to participate in public and political life without fear of harassment or intimidation.

Outputs:	

- Two three-day training workshops on gender and identity-based disinformation for women's rights organizations and women in public life from east and west Georgia (up to 30 women, including at least 30% ethnic minorities).
- Training manuals for the three-day workshops with WROs and WIPL on understanding and responding GID and related threats; resource materials, presentations and handouts used during the workshops.
- Five face-to-face meetings with local women leaders and activists on strategies to timely detect and counter gender disinformation.
- Reports summarising the discussions, insights and outcomes of the three-day workshops and the meetings involving WROs/WIPL from Tbilisi, Kvemo Kartli, Kakheti, Samtskhe-Javakheti, Imereti, Achara and Racha.

Cases of gender disinformation advised on and referred (where relevant) by Sapari lawyers,

Social media posts and other online content to raise awareness and understanding of GID, and to promote the project's findings and recommendations.
